NASDJA Preamble

The North American South Devon Junior Association, herein after referred to as NASDJA, is the official youth organization of the North American South Devon Association, hereafter known as NASDA. NASDJA and its members will be subject to all rules and bylaws of the North American South Devon Association unless otherwise specified herein.

Article I: Name and Purpose

Section 1: The North American South Devon Junior Association is an official entity of and shall operate within the scope of bylaws, rules, policies and regulations of the North American South Devon Association.

Section 2: The objectives and purposes of the NASDJA, shall be as follows:

- (a) Improve and promote the South Devon breed.
- (b) To improve and promote the capabilities of youth, both individually and through group participation, in breeding, raising, exhibiting and promoting the South Devon breed.
- (c) To provide a mechanism where the junior members may work congruently with the North American South Devon Association.
- (d) To acquaint junior members, with the structure and functions of NASDJA and NASDA.
- (e) To promote leadership, by encouraging high moral character, sportsmanship and clean living.
- (f) To assist state associations with their youth programs and activities.
- (g) Inform and promote all activities undertaken by either NASDJA or NASDA.

Article 2: Membership and Voting

Section 1: Membership; active members shall be persons twenty-one (21) years of age or under as of January 1, of the membership year.

Section 2: Voting; voting rights in the organization shall be vested exclusively with active paid members.

Section 3: Divisions; The association members will be classified into the following Divisions:

- A. Pee-Wee: 7 years of age and under as of January 1.
- B. Junior: 8-12 years of age as of January 1.
- C. Intermediate: 13-17 years of age as of January 1.
- D. Senior: 18-21 years of age as of January 1.

Article 3: Board of Directors, Officers

A. Requirements

Section 1: The affairs of this association shall be managed by a Board of Directors consisting of a President, Vice President, Secretary and three directors. A quorum shall consist of five (5) members in attendance at any Directors meeting.

Section 2: Only paid-up, active or founding members, 14-years of age or older and in good standing with the association, may be Directors. Each director shall be limited to three (3) consecutive two (2) year terms and shall be eligible for re-election after a one (1) year absence.

Section 3: The term for an NASDJA board member is two years. However, should a director have his 22nd birthday after the conference, he/she must retire at the following conference, regardless of years left in his/her term.

Section 4: Replacements for resigned or deceased Directors will be appointed by the Board of Directors to serve until the next fiscal election.

Section 5: Any director missing (2) consecutive Board Meetings shall be deemed to have submitted his/her resignation, which shall be acted upon by the Board and which may either be accepted or rejected by the Board. Board members must physically attend at least one (1) Board meeting each year.

B. Elections

The nomination of active members for a position on the Board of Directors of NASDJA will take place as follows:

Section 1: All candidates **MUST** submit a written application that is available from the NASDA Activities Director. Junior board applications will be collected in the NASDA office by June 1. Candidates for election must be nominated from the floor at the NASDJA General Membership meeting. The member nominated will be required to present a nomination speech to outline his/her qualifications for office.

Section 2: A President, Vice President, Secretary and three directors will be elected by ballot by the general membership of the NASDJA at the designated General membership meeting.

Section 3: Elected Officers shall serve for a two (2) year term with a limit of three (3) consecutive two (2) year terms.

Section 3: The Board of Directors shall have the power and authority to:

A. Direct the affairs of the organization, including but not limited to, the right to amend or repeal the constitution of the organization, subject to a vote by the board of directors.

Article 4: Meetings

Section 1: Membership Meetings; The annual meeting of the active association members shall be held at such a time and place as may be fixed by the Executive Board of the organization, for the purpose of electing Trustees to the Board and conducting other business, as may be brought before the meeting.

Section 2: Standard parliamentary procedure as defined by *Robert's Rules of Order* shall be followed at all meetings of the association membership.

Article 5: Place of Business

Section 1: The official place of business for this organization shall be the North American South Devon Association, Parker, Colorado.

Article 6: Livestock Shows

Section 1:

Junior South Devon Exhibitors are required to wear tucked-in, collared shirts (NASDJA polo's) while in the show ring at all junior nationals, regional and state shows. Some shows do have a required dress code that must be worn in order to show, however at all other shows exhibitors should dress appropriately. Dark pants, a light-colored shirt and boots are suggested. T-shirts, shorts, athletic shoes, etc. are discouraged. Hats and caps should not be worn.

Section 2:

A. No animal shown may be transferred after the show or have a paper corrected after the show with a sale date prior to the show. Such a transfer or correction will cause the animal to be ineligible for competition for any (junior or open) association-sponsored show for one year.

B. Junior Nationals: Animals must be registered in the sole ownership of the junior exhibitor ten(10) days prior to the show, of the year of competition. No animal shown may be transferred after the show or have a paper corrected after the show with a sale date prior to the show. See Item A, Section 2. All bred-and-owned females and bulls must show the exhibitor as owning the entry's dam at the time of conception.

Section 3: Junior Nationals, Regional and State Shows

Purebred and Percentage Cattle will show separately.

Purebred Division: Only registered females with 75% or greater South Devon blood are eligible to show.

Percentage Division: Only registered females between 25% and 74.9% South Devon blood are eligible to show.

Classes for Purebred and Percentage Divisions:

 7. Senior Heifer Calf : 9/1-10/31, of previous year
 8. Late Summer Yearling Female: 7/1-8/31 of previous year
 9. Early Summer Yearling Female: 5/1-6/30 of previous year
 10. Intermediate Champion Female
 11. Reserve Intermediate Champion Female
 12. Late Spring Yearling Female: 4/1-4/30, of previous year
 13. Early Spring Yearling Female: 3/1-3/31, of previous year
 14. Junior Yearling Female: 1/1-2/28, of previous year
 15. Junior Champion Female
 16. Reserve Junior Champion Female
 17. Senior Yearling Female: between 9/1-12/31, two years previous
 18. Senior Champion Female
 19. Reserve Senior Champion Female
 20. Grand Champion Female
 21. Reserve Grand Champion Female
 22. Two year old female with calf: Cows must be born after 1/1 two years previous . Calf must be under 250 days of age or younger and nursing.
 23. Mature Cow-Calf: Cows three to six years of age. Calf must be under 250 days of age or younger and nursing.
- Purebred and Percentage Cow/Calf Pairs will show separately. The lowest percentage of the pair will determine the division the pair will be shown in. Purebred: 75% or greater. Percentage: 74.9% or less.
24. Champion Cow/Calf
 25. Reserve Champion Cow/Calf

Bred and Owned Female Show: Females exhibited in the Bred and Owned class must show the exhibitor as owning the entry's dam **at the time of conception**. The exhibitor must be listed as the breeder on the registration paper. Purebred and percentage bred and owned females will show separately. The same classes will pertain to the Bred and Owned division as previously listed.

Bred and Owned Bull Show:

Bulls exhibited in the Bred and Owned classes must show the exhibitor as owning the entry's dam **at the time of conception**. The exhibitor must be listed as the breeder on the registration paper. Purebred and percentage bred and owned bulls will show separately. All bulls showing in the bred and owned bull show must be 87.5% or higher percentage. No bull over 12 months of age will be allowed to show.

Article 7: National South Devon Ambassador Program

Section 1: Purpose; The National South Devon Ambassador Contest is to select an outstanding junior member to represent the South Devon Association in various public appearances.

Section 2: Rules; The National South Devon Ambassador will be held during the annual Junior Nationals.

A. Contestants entry forms must be submitted by June 1, to the standing committee of the National South Devon Junior Ambassador program.

B. Senior Candidates must be between the ages of sixteen (16) and nineteen (19) years of age by the day of the contest.

C. Junior Candidates will be between the ages of eleven (11) to fifteen (15).

D. Candidates will be required to talk on one of the following:

1. Promoting the South Devon breed.
2. Promoting more beef consumption.
3. Any subject related to the beef industry.

E. The contestants will meet with the Standing Committee and will be asked questions concerning:

1. Agriculture knowledge
2. Background
3. Expectations
4. South Devon knowledge

F. The Members that receive the title of National South Devon Ambassador, will serve a term of two (2) years and will never exceed two (2) consecutive terms in each division.

Article 8: Amendments

Section 1: The Constitution of NASDJA may be amended at the annual meeting by a two-thirds vote of the members present and voting.

Section 2: Proposed amendments to the constitution may be brought before the annual membership meeting only if previously approved by majority vote, of the NASDJA Board of Directors.

Article 9: NASDJA 'JUNIOR NATIONALS'

(Competitions may vary from year-to-year. The host state and junior committee can add competitions and activities as desired.)

Sponsorship & Eligibility

1. This show is sponsored by the North American South Devon Junior Association (NASDJA) and the North American South Devon Association (NASDA). The show is open to all NASDJA members. Members who turned 22-years-old before January 1, of the year of competition are not eligible.
2. Animals must be registered in the sole ownership of the junior exhibitor 10 days prior to the show, of the year of competition to be eligible to show.
3. Current original registration certificates or copies for each animal must be presented at the time of check-in. Tattoos found to be missing, illegible, or in any way incorrect with official NASDA records will be disqualified.
4. Entries must meet host state health regulations and present interstate health papers at time of check-in.
5. Entry fees are \$25 per head. Entries must be postmarked on or before the date specified by the host committee and/or the junior committee, of the year of competition. The deadline for late entries will also be specified and an increased fee of \$40 per head will apply.
6. Cattle check-in time will be scheduled by the host committee.
7. Stalls will be assigned to exhibitors according to state. No Fan Cages and No Aisle Fans: A aisle fan is defined as an individual, movable fan placed in the aisle or be-

8. To maintain a high degree of confidence in the show, the NASDJA reserves the right to disqualify any animals that have been fit or treated in an unethical manner. Unethical fitting includes any injection of gas, solid or liquid under the skin to alter the normal conformation of the animal. This includes any cutting or tearing of the hide, or underneath the hide, or removal of any tissue in an attempt to alter the shape of the animal. Any attempts to disrupt or change normal dental development, dying or coloring of the hair coat that alters the natural coloration or artificial tail or tail head polls will disqualify the animal. Any attempt to change the degree of firmness of any animal is considered unethical. Artificial means that the filling of cattle internally is prohibited.
9. Bedding in the barn and tie-outs will be designated by the host committee.
10. Exhibitors must be present to exhibit their own animals entered in the show; emergencies will be decided on by the NASDJA Board of Directors.
11. All members of the NASDJA in attendance at the Junior Nationals are expected to conduct themselves in a manner becoming an NASDJA member and abide by the on-site directives of the host state. Violations of these standards include, but are not limited to: misrepresentation of animals, vandalism, theft, fighting, unsportsmanlike conduct, failure to comply with the directives of officials, being under the influence of intoxicating or prohibited substances, or willful violation of rules. Failure to adhere to the above regulations may lead to disciplinary actions, which may include expulsion from the event at the discretion of the NASDJA/NASDA staff and/or a disciplinary committee.
12. Classes and division will be broken as proportionately to age and class size as possible, and will be guided by the class break allowances specified in the NASDJA Constitution and Bylaws. Class breaks will be posted at least one day prior to the day of the show and are at the discretion of the NASDA staff.
13. Grievances must be filed with the NASDJA Junior Advisory Board, which consists of the members of the NASDA Junior Committee 24 hours before the show. In any disputes, the decision of the North American South Devon Association Representative and/or the NASDJA Junior Advisory Board will stand.
14. Disclaimer: The North American South Devon Association or anyone else involved with the show, will not be responsible for any loss or injury to livestock, feed or persons.

Dress Code

All juniors will be required to wear the junior national t-shirt and the official NASDJA polo at designated times.

NASDJA Junior National Show

(See Article 6 for a breakdown of classes)

The NASDJA Junior National Female Show will be divided into South Devon Heifers, South Devon Percentage Heifers, Bred-and-Owned Heifers and Cow/Calf. The judge will select a champion and reserve champion from each group. Purebred and percentage animals will show separately.

South Devon Heifer Show: Heifers exhibited in the South Devon Heifer Show must be a registered female with 75% or greater South Devon blood to be eligible. No heifers older than a Senior Yearling are eligible to show in this division.

South Devon Percentage Heifer Show: Heifers exhibited in the South Devon Percentage Heifer Show must be a registered percentage female between 25% and 74.9%. No heifers older than a Senior Yearling are eligible to show in this division.

South Devon Bred-and-Owned Heifer Show: Heifers exhibited in the Bred-and-Owned class must show the exhibitor as owning the entry's dam at the time of conception. The exhibitor must be listed as the breeder on the registration paper. The purebred and percentage bred and owned females will show separately.

Cow/Calf: Two classes of cow/calf pairs will be exhibited: two-year-old cows and cows 3 to 6 years of age and lactating with their natural born calf at side that is under 250 days old. Heifer calves may enter individual heifer classes and Bred-and Owned divisions. Bull calves may be entered in the Bred and Owned Bull Division.

Steers: The NASDJA Steer Show will be divided into two divisions, percentage and purebred steers. Purebred steers must be 75% or greater and percentage steers must be from 25% to 74.9% South Devon. Registration papers are required. There will be two classifications in each of the two divisions: Prospect Division – steers weighing 1,050 lbs. or less; Market division – steers weighing 1,051 lbs. or more. Classes will be broken by weight.

Bred-and-Owned Bull Show: Bulls exhibited in the Bred-and-Owned show must show the exhibitor as owning the entry's dam **at the time of conception**. The exhibitor must be listed as the breeder on the registration paper. See Article VI for a breakdown of classes.

Premier Breeder & Premier Exhibitor

The NASDJA will present an award to the premier exhibitor and premier breeder of the show. The premier exhibitor will be determined by the exhibitor's placement in individual heifer, cow/calf, steer, and bull classes. Placements will also be used to determine the premier breeder award. Points are accumulated as follows: 1st place – 3 pts.; 2nd place – 2 pts.; 3rd place – 1 pt. Maximum number of placements used to determine the winner shall be limited to three. In the case of a tie, additional placements will be used.

Showmanship Contest

1. Any individual in attendance at the NASDJA Junior National is eligible provided he or she is a member of the NASDJA and complies with the age eligibility for he NASDJA Junior Nationals.
2. Bulls cannot be shown in any showmanship classes.
3. Contestants do not have to show their own animal, but the animal exhibited in the showmanship contest has to be entered in the NASDJA Junior National.

4. Contestants will compete in four divisions: Pee-Wee, Junior, Intermediate and Senior.
 - Pee-Wee: 7 years of age and under as of January 1
 - Junior: 8-12 years of age as of January 1
 - Intermediate: 13-17 years of age as of January 1
 - Senior: 18-21 years of age as of January 1
5. All contestants must pre-register at the designated contest sign-in.
6. Contestants will be judged primarily on their own appearance (neatness) and showmanship ability.
7. No outside assistance will be allowed during the competition.

Quiz Bowl Competition

1. The primary objective of the Quiz Bowl is to provide the opportunity for National Junior South Devon Association members to demonstrate their knowledge of South Devon beef cattle and the purebred cattle industry.
2. Contestants will compete in four divisions: Pee-Wee, Junior, Intermediate and Senior.
 - Pee-Wee: 7 years of age and under as of January 1
 - Junior: 8-12 years of age as of January 1
 - Intermediate: 13-17 years of age as of January 1
 - Senior: 18-21 years of age as of January 1
3. Contestants will be divided into preliminary rounds depending on the number of individuals in each age category. In each round, the contestant will draw a number to correspond with a question. Each round will have the same questions for all competing individuals.
4. The first round will consist of one, 10 question round. The top two from each match will proceed to the next round.
5. Contestants will have 10 seconds to answer each question.
6. In the case of a tie, three additional questions will be asked.
7. Each question is worth 1 point.
8. There will be two officials who will determine the accuracy of the answers.
9. Members of the NASDA board will help with scoring, moderating and overseeing the contest.

Team Marketing Contest

1. The main objective of the Team Marketing is to encourage team participation while promoting the importance of communication skills, marketing technique and an understanding of performance and pedigree information.
2. Any individual in attendance at the NASDJA Junior National is eligible provided he or she is a member of the NASDJA and complies with the age eligibility for the NASDJA Junior Nationals.
There will be three divisions, Junior (8-12); Intermediate (13-17) and Senior (18-21), with three members on a team.

5. Presentations will be from 3-6 minutes long. Each individual on the team will be expected to speak during the time period. The objective of each team will be to convince the three judges that they should purchase the team's entry. Three topics should be discussed (in terms of the entry): (a) pedigree information, (b) performance information, (c) visual characteristics. Other information may be given; judges' questions will not necessarily be limited to the three topics mentioned above. Teams will be discounted for using notes.
6. The order of team presentation will be determined by a drawing after pre-registration and will be posted prior to the contest.
7. Each team will be responsible for selecting an animal to use in the competition. Entries to be groomed, but should be clean and will be checked for oil, hair spray, glue, etc., before entering the arena. No grooming supplies will be allowed in the area. Each team must present the entry's registration certificate to the judges. Other visual aids may be used but are optional. Only the entry being marketed may be brought in front of the judges. Other animals may not be used as visual aids. Only live animals may be marketed – no flushes or embryos.
8. Points will be awarded as follows:
 - Knowledge – 25 points
 - Ability to communicate – 25 points
 - Team organization – 25 points
 - Overall effect – 25 points (Salesmanship, Creativity/Originality, Believability)
 - Ten points will be subtracted from the total if judges detect the use of notes. Five points will be subtracted if registration certificates are not submitted. Five points will be subtracted if all three team members do not speak. Two points will be subtracted for each minute a team's presentation goes over six minutes.
9. Judging will be by a two-member panel of judges based on 100 points maximum from each judge. Each judge will then rank the teams based on points allocated. Judges will determine the final placing.

Golden Pitchfork Award

The Golden Pitchfork award was developed to encourage junior exhibitors to work together in the display of their cattle, as well as to create state pride during the NASDJA Junior National.

The award is presented to a state association that displays a combination of cleanliness, uniformity in stalling (such as exhibitor cards, panels, etc.) and additional decoration of the area representing the state. The winning state will receive a cash award and the traveling golden pitchfork to be displayed at the next year's NASDJA Junior National. Cash awards will also be presented to second and third place states.

Evaluation - A panel of judges including one individual from the NASDA Junior Committee, one from the host state and one adult from a past winning state will evaluate the stalls daily throughout the Junior National based upon the point system listed. The point system is:

Cleanliness/Neatness – 45
Uniformity of Stalls – 35
Storage of Feed & Equipment – 10
Decorations (extra effort) 10
Total Points 100

The top three states will be announced during the show. Cash awards are: 1st Place: \$100, 2nd Place: \$50, 3rd Place \$25.

Outstanding Junior Herdsman Award

This award is presented annually to one exhibitor during the NASDJA Junior Nationals.

Eligibility Requirements:

All Junior National exhibitors are eligible to receive the award.

An individual may receive the award once.

Selection:

A nomination committee will observe exhibitors throughout the Junior National and nominate three individuals. The nomination committee will consist of one member of the NASDA Junior Committee, one member from the Host Committee and one past Outstanding Junior Herdsman Award winner. If one past winner is not in attendance an additional NASDA Junior Committee member will be selected. Each of the three nominated individuals will receive 10 points. In addition the following point system will be used to determine the Outstanding Junior Herdsman:

Exhibit one or more animals: 10 points

Serve as a Mentor: 10 points

Each nominated individual will be asked 5 questions related to the South Devon breed.

For each correct answer one point will be awarded.

If contestants place in the top two of any of the listed contests including showmanship, marketing, quiz bowl, or any other sponsored competition they will receive points for the following: 1st place: 10 points; 2nd place: 9 points.

In selection, emphasis is placed on the exhibitor's sportsmanship, presentation of show entries, work habits, honesty and knowledge of the South Devon industry.

NASDJA Mentoring Program

The NASDJA mentoring program is an opportunity for junior South Devon members to utilize their experience at the NASDJA Junior Nationals to assist amateur exhibitors at this event. It gives juniors of all ages the opportunity to meet and interact with members from different states.

Mentors: Junior members interested in mentoring must be 14-years of age or older and have attended at least three previous NASDJA Junior Nationals. Mentors must be able to have time to check on their protégés at least once a day.

Protégés: Protégés can be first, second or third-time exhibitors at the Junior National who indicate they would like to have a mentor for the duration of the Junior Nationals.

1. Interested juniors can check the appropriate box at the end of their Junior National entry form.
2. Mentors and protégés will be assigned before the event.
3. Mentors will be assigned to a protégé from a different state.
4. Mentors will be able to find out who their protégés are during sign up.
5. Participants will be recognized at the opening ceremonies.

Guidelines for Mentors:

The importance of this position is to help your protégé feel at home during the Junior Nationals and to help them meet and interact with other juniors.

1. Help your protégé with rules and basic information about the Junior National.
2. Take him or her to any competitions or contests that you may be involved with or you think he or she may be interested in.
3. Introduce him to other juniors.

AGREEMENT OF RESPONSIBILITY AND LIABILITY

It is clearly understood and agreed that the North American South Devon Association and its officials, officers, directors, employees and agents (hereinafter collectively referred to as "the Association") shall not be responsible for any damage, loss or injury to any person or property which is caused directly or indirectly for any reason.

The exhibitor, owner, their agents and/or representatives, (hereinafter collectively referred to as "Participants"), agree to indemnify and hold the Association harmless for any damage, injury or loss suffered during or in connection with the NASDJA Junior National. In the event the Association is subject to any expense or liability, including, but not limited to consultant fees, legal or court costs, the Association management labor and expenses, expenses and/or costs for blood, tissue, urine, hide and/or carcass sampling and testing incurred as a result of the Association's rules and regulations violations and all agreements there under, including, but not limited to unethical fitting, filling, meat tampering, illegal or non-approved use of drugs, medication and/or prohibited substance(s) as a result of participants involvement in the NASDJA Junior National, participant shall indemnify and hold harmless the Association for all damage, expenses and liabilities incurred as a result thereof. Participant may also be subject to criminal charges.

The participant will have full control, custody, care and feeding of any animal(s) and/or personal property, which are brought on or about the premises of the NASDJA Junior National. It is clearly understood and agreed between the parties that, as a material condition to any participant entering or showing at the national, regional and NASDJA Junior National. The Association will at no time have control, custody or care of any animal(s) and/or personal property, which are brought on or about the NASDJA Junior National show site. For the overall working of the show, the participant will maintain control, custody, care and feeding for any and all animals and/or personal property in accordance with the

rules and regulations of the NASDJA Junior National, and in no way will the Association be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur or be caused by any animal or personal property.

By submitting an application for entry, participants agree to comply with all the rules and regulations governing the NASDJA Junior National as published in the rules governed under the North American South Devon Association rules. Further, these provisions include total ownership of the entry for the prescribed number of days, continuous possession and care and provisions against unethical fitting, filling, and/or alteration of conformation and color of animal(s), meat tampering and illegal or non-approved use of drugs, medication and/or prohibited substance.

All animals competing in the NASDJA Junior National need to be broke and controllable by the junior member. The NASDA show and sale committee reserves the right to disqualify from the NASDJA Junior National any animals determined to be unruly and cause a threat to the safety of any participants. All decisions by the NASDA show and sale committee will be final.



APPLICATION FORM

North American South Devon Junior Board of Directors

Any individual interested in running for an office will be required to complete an application and give a prepared 2-3 minute election speech at the annual meeting. The offices open are president, vice president, secretary and three directors. One of the directors will serve as parliamentarian. Officers will be required to attend the annual Junior National and one other junior event during each year of service. Each officer will serve a two-year term. NASDJA officers will have the opportunity to attend the bi-annual Youth Beef Industry Congress. Deadline for completed application is June 1.
