Application Deadline for Youth Heifer October 1

2023 donation heifer to be presented at the 50th National Show in Denver, Colorado

Each year juniors participate in an application process to be eligible to receive a heifer donated by generous sponsors. Applications are currently being accepted for the 2023 heifer. Juniors 14-20 years-of-age may apply.

The 2023 heifer will be the tenth heifer to be donated and will be provided by 9 Mile Ranch, Kristin Dykes, Walla Walla, WA, in memory of Josh Dykes.

North American South Devon Association juniors will compete for top awards at the annual Junior National Show and Leadership Conference scheduled June 29-July 2 at the Pierce County Fairgrounds, Ellsworth, Wisconsin.

Juniors from across the U.S. will participate in a junior heifer, steer and bred-and-owned bull show, showmanship, marketing, quiz bowl, speech, poster and photography competitions.

The four-day event will be packed with contests and activities for four divisions; Peewee, Junior, Intermediate and Senior.

Juniors will also compete for the coveted Herdsman of the Year, Heartland Challenge, Premier Breeder and Exhibitor and Golden Pitchfork awards.

As one of the biggest events of the year, the South Devon Junior National is an event that no junior member or breeder should miss.

Juniors will showcase their cattle on Friday during the Bred-and-Owned

South Devon and Poundmaker Heifer, Bred-and-Owned Bull and Steer show.

The South Devon and Poundmaker owned show will be held on Saturday, followed by showmanship.

This year's event is packed full of fun activities, educational experiences and professional development opportunities.

The four-day event will conclude with an awards celebration on Saturday afternoon.



Registration & Health

Animals must be registered in the sole ownership of the junior exhibitor, **ten** days prior to the show.

Original registrations certificates or copies for each animal should be present at time of check-in. Entries must meet Wisconsin Health Regulations.

Juniors must be members of the North American South Devon Junior Association. An application for membership can be filled out at registration if you are not a member, and the \$15 set up and \$20 annual fee can be paid at that time.

Entries are due May 20. On-site registration is also available. The registration fee is \$40 per head.

- ◆ There will be a separate showmanship division for age 4 and under, called Little Beefers. They must have an older exhibitor as a mentor. The Peewee division age classification, will be 5-7 years old.

Photography Contest Update

All photos for the 2022 'Junior National' photo contest must have been taken by the NASDJA member within one year of the date of the photo contest. Photos submitted must be 8" x 10", color and mounted. There are three classes: Candid, Scenic and Cattle. The junior photographer can submit up to six entries, with no more than two entries per class. List your name and age on the back of the photo.

Heartland Challenge

To be eligible for the Heartland Challenge, participants must compete in at least three of the following contests: Marketing, Quiz Bowl, Photo, Speech and Showmanship. Contestants competing in at least three of the qualifying contests are automatically in contention for the award.

NASDJA Board Update

The North American South Devon Association junior committee members voted to extend the terms of the junior officers due to the loss of a year of activities, because of Covid. All current directors and ambassadors will hold their term until Summer of 2022.

At the 2022 Junior National Show and Leadership Conference, a President, Vice President, Secretary and four directors will be elected. The directors shall elect from their own number a President, Vice President and Secretary. Directors will be elected by ballot, by the general membership of the NASDJA at the designated general membership meeting.

In order to serve as the President, Vice President or Secretary, juniors must have served a two-year term as a director. If any director, currently serving a two-year term who would like to run for a higher office, must submit a written application. Should they be elected to a higher office, a special election for a one-year term will be performed as an acting board member to fulfill the obligations of the vacant two-year term.

New Rules, Fees and Updates >>>

The North American South Devon Junior Association Board of Directors and Junior Committee members met in January during the 2019 and 2020 national events and updated the Junior Handbook.

Summary of Actions...

- Entry fees for the annual Junior National will be \$40 per head.
- A ‘State’ Best Four Head division was added to the Junior National class listing.
- The number of directors was increased from 3 to 4 and directors will elect from their own number, President, Vice President and Secretary.
- A Spring Yearling class was added to the bull show.
- A printed version will be required in the Prepared Speech Contest.
- The mentor program was discontinued.

- *All cattle exhibited at the 2022 North American South Devon Junior National Show will be shown in their natural conformation. The use of false tail heads, color altering adhesives or paint and /or adding hair or other materials to any part of the animal's body is prohibited.*
- *Don't forget to coordinate a state display to compete for the Golden Pitchfork Award. The award is presented to a state association that displays a combination of cleanliness, uniformity in stalling and additional decoration of the area representing the state. The winning state will receive a cash award and travelling golden pitchfork. Cash awards will also be presented to second and third place states.*
- *Make your room reservations early. Blocked rooms are under the NASDJA Jr. Association at the Country Inn and Econo Lodge.*
- *A barbeque and hospitality will be hosted by KNN Farms following the awards celebration.*
